Past simple of be: was/ were

USE:

We use the past simple to talk about finished events in the past.

FORM:

Affirmative		Negative		
		long form		short form
I	was	I	was not	I wasn't
she, he, it	was	she, he, it	was not	he wasn't
we, you, they	were	we, you, they	were not	we weren't

Question		Short answer		
		positive	negative	
Was	I?	Yes, I was.	No, I wasn't.	
Was	she, he, it?	Yes, she was.	No, he wasn't.	
Were	we, you, they?	Yes, they were.	No, we weren't.	

EXAMPLES:

Affirmative - She was at the library yesterday.

Negative - She was not (=wasn't) at the library yesterday.

Interrogative - Was she at the library yesterday? Yes, she was. / No, she wasn't.

Affirmative - You were in Tenerife last year.

Negative - You were not (=weren't) in Tenerife last year.

Interrogative - Were you in Tenerife last year?

Yes, I was. / No, I wasn't.
