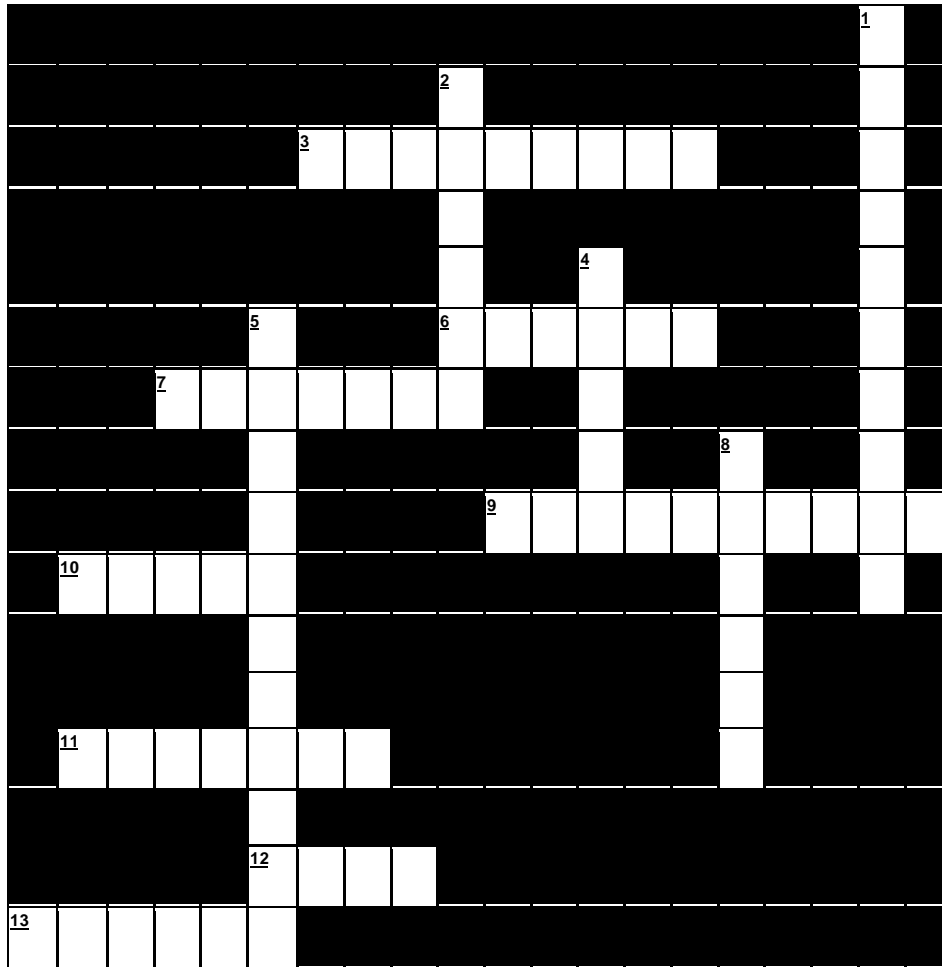


- Stepfather:** the man who is married to someone's mother but who is not their real father.
- Stepmother:** the woman who is married to someone's father but who is not their real mother.
- Stepdaughter:** the daughter of your husband or wife from a previous marriage.
- Stepson:** the son of your husband or wife from a previous marriage.
- Stepbrother:** not your parents' son, but the son of a person that one of your parents has married.
- Stepsister:** not your parents' daughter, but the daughter of a person one of your parents has married.
- Half-sister:** a sister who is the daughter of only one of your parents.
- Half-brother:** a brother who is the son of only one of your parents.
- Mummy:** a word for mother, used especially by children.
- Mum:** <informal> mother.
- Daddy:** a word for 'father', used especially by children.
- Dad:** <informal> father.
- Grandma/ Granny/ Grannie:** <informal> grandmother.
- Grandpa/ Granddad/ Grandad:** <informal> grandfather.
- Big/little brother/sister:** older/ younger brother/sister.
- Wife:** the woman to whom a man is married.
- Partner:** the person you are married to or living with as if you were married to them, or the person you are having a sexual relationship with.
- Relative:** a member of your family.

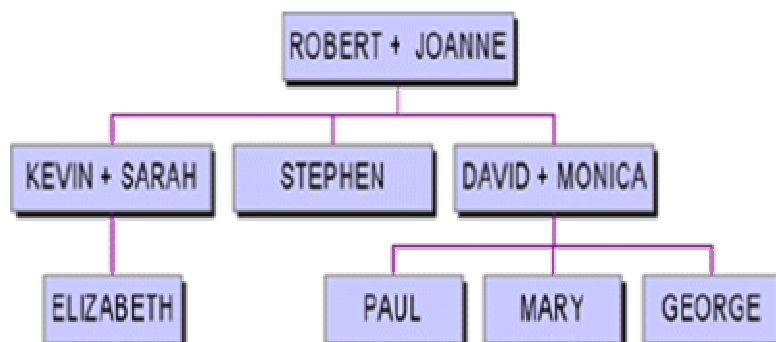
